Extended Field Care is "holding onto a sicker patient than you can care for, for longer than you want, with fewer resources than you need, in a place you don't want to be."

Evidently, this doesn't just occur in military operational settings; it occurs in civilian settings as well. We want to explore the ways that the US military, ICRC and MSF are currently implementing extended field care with a focus specifically on expanding key trauma care concepts that directly relate to pre-hospital interventions. Finally a hands on practical exposure to new innovative EMS devices with skill stations will be included in this seminar. All courses will be held at Maskwacis Ambulance Training Facility.
